Berlin has over 170 **museums**, making the city one of the world's prime locations for high-calibre historical collections of art, culture and technology, along with scientific collections.

In the following we would like to present you a selection of some museums with different main focus:

Museum Island

Berlin's world-famous Museum Island is the northern half of an island in the Spree river, in the center of the city. The island received its name for several internationally renowned museums constructed under several Prussian kings. The five museums (**Old Museum**, New Museum, **Old National Gallery**, Bode Museum, **Pergamon Museum**) on the island accommodate the archaeological collections and art of the 19th century.

Pergamon Museum

The Pergamon is Berlin's prime museum. It houses three outstanding collections under one roof: the Antiquity Collection, the Museum of the Near East and the Museum of Islamic Art.

Old Museum

Beside Greek and Roman art and sculptures you will find on the upper floor the Egyptian collection which includes the busts of Queen Nefertiti, one of the most famous pieces of art, and the collection of the Papyrus scripts.

Old National Gallery

Paintings and sculptures from the 19th century are on display here. The gallery contains paintings from the German Romantic period, including works by Caspar David Friedrich and Karl Blechen and French Impressionists including Monet, Cézanne, and Renoir.

New National Gallery

The New National Gallery houses 20th-century European painting and sculpture from classical modernism to the art of the 1960s and interesting special exhibitions.

German Historical Museum

This exhibit presents a tour of the vicissitudes of German history in its greater European context from the beginning of our common era into the present.

German Technology Museum

This museum of Technical Cultural History with Science Center Spectrum shows exhibitions on the history of communication, aviation and navigation.
