In 1969, the Fund for the Replacement of Animal in Medical Experiments (FRAME) was founded as a charitable trust by Mrs Dorothy Hegarty and Dr Charles Foister, "to promote or assist in the provision of research into acceptable new techniques and substitutes for the use of animals, particularly when such animals are being used for medical, biological, pharmaceutical and other research purposes".

Minutes of Meeting of Trustees held on 19th November 1979

CO-OPTED - Mr B H Annett Dr P Hodges attended as an observer

Re-appointment of Chairman: Dr Foister proposed and Dr Balls seconded that Mrs Hegarty be re-appointed Chairman for the ensuing year. This was carried unanimously.

- 1. <u>Confirmation of Minutes</u>: Minutes of the previous meetings held on 1st August and 26th October were confirmed and duly signed.
- 2. <u>Matters Arising</u>: <u>Facts Sheets</u> These will now be extended to cover further subjects.
- 3. <u>Trustees:</u> Mrs E Glynne-Jones and Dr M Balls were welcomed as new Trustees, and it was felt these appointments would help to strengthen our efforts.

## **Events in the History of FRAME**

- 1969 FRAME established in London
- 1975 MB moves from Norwich (UEA) to Nottingham
- 1976 Visit of Professor David Smyth (Alternatives to Animal Experiments)
- 1978 Royal Society meeting on The Use of Alternatives in Drug Research
- 1979 MB becomes a FRAME Trustee
- 1981 Formation of All Party Parliamentary FRAME Group
- 1981 MB becomes Chairman of FRAME Trustees
- 1981 FRAME moves to Nottingham
- 1982 FRAME Research Programme established
- 1983 FRAME advises Govt on Animals (Scientific Procedures) Act 1986

### **FRAME Events continued**

- 1983 FRAME receives first Government grant for alternatives research
- 1983 Re-launch of ATLA as a peer-review international journal
- 1983 FRAME International Test Validation Scheme and INVITTOX database established
- 1992 Establishment of the FRAME Alternatives Laboratory (FAL) at the University of Nottingham, following refurbishment of the departmental tissue culture suite (funded by FRAME)
- 1993 MB moves to become Head of Unit at ECVAM at EC JRC, Ispra, Italy, and Richard Clothier becomes Head of the FAL
- 1995 Opening of Russell & Burch House by W.M.S.Russell
- **2007** Further refurbishment and extension of the FAL (partly funded by FRAME)
- 1982–2009 FRAME donations totalling *circa* £5,000,000 to the University for support of research in the School of Biomedical Sciences
